


#### **SUPPLIES LIST**



#### Supplies List\*

**Watercolor Paper:** I use <u>Strathmore Vision Cold Press Watercolor Pad</u> 9"X12"-140lb

**Flat Board:** I used <u>Clay Board</u> but you can use anything flat and hard that you can tape your watercolor paper to.

**Watercolor Brushes:** I used a #2 and #4 Round ( <u>Nice set</u> of rounds with different sizes) and a #9 Angle (<u>Nice set</u> with lots of sizes)

Watercolors: I used <u>Pink Palette of Time by Art to Basic</u>, <u>Art Philosophy Pastel</u>

<u>Dreams</u> and <u>my own palette</u> A great way to test out Daniel Smith watercolors is to use the <u>66 Color Dot Card</u>.

Artist Tape
Water Jar
Paper Towels
Scissors

Glue Stick or other adhesive: I use Pritt

**Paper Cutter** 

Pencil: I used General #333 2HB but a No. 2 will work fine
Watercolor Pencils and I also used <u>Carbothello Pastel Pencils</u>
Black Stabilo ALL Pencil or a Black Pencil

Very Fine Tip Black Waterproof Pen

White Pencil, Oil Pastel or <u>Presto Fine Point Correcting Pen</u> (I ended up using white acrylic paint with a tiny paint brush.)

**Found words from magazines or books:** I typed mine onto heavy tracing paper but you can also use <u>vellum</u>. I like a 45lb to 50lb weight.

Assorted fabric and lace bits, embroidery thread and embroidery needle
Optional: Sewing Machine and stapler
