Materials & Supplies List:

Part 1 - Making Collage Paper

I have covered my work surface and gathered:

Jar of water

Paper towels

Spritz bottle for priming watercolors

Watercolor Paints - I am using a Dahler Rowney set

Paper - I am using graph paper

Pencil

Mark Making Tools - I have "crayons" on hand:

Crayola, Caran d'ache NeoColor 2s and Stabilo

Woodys, plus a chunky white Posca Pen size 8mm

Watercolor Inks are fun too!

Brush(es) - I am using a ¾ inch flat craft brush, a

small round craft brush and a 1" chip brush

Gesso - white

... and you may like a hair dryer or heat-it craft tool
for speeding up dry time

Part 2 - Creating Your Custom Tin:

Tin - I use a regular size (empty) Peppermint Altoid
tin

A "spray box" used for containing spray paint - I use
an old shoe box

Kilz Primer Spray Paint

Spray Paint in the color of your choice - I used

Krylon ColorMaxx "Matte Aqua"

Sand Paper - I use 60 grit

Wax - I use chunks of old candles

Collage Paper made in Part 1

Index card or card stock to create a "composition
window"

Pencil and Eraser

Scissors

Adhesive to adhere paper to tin - I use YES! Paste
with a plastic palette knife applicator

X-acto Craft Knife + Cutting Mat

White Heavy Body Acrylic Paint or White Heavy
Body Gesso to "brighten" the inside of the lid

Empty ½ pans (or paints purchased in pans)

Adhesive to adhere pans to the tin, for example,
magnet tape - I use Ticky Tac

Tube Watercolors of your choice to fill empty half
pans
