2. **How** does the allegory of the cave work?

Just as Animal Farm reveals something about Russian history, the allegory of the cave reveals something about society, nature, and human knowledge of reality. In the first half of the allegory, Socrates portrays a group of prisoners that is beholden to a shadow puppet show, and claims that all human beings are like these prisoners in some way; in the second half of the allegory, he describes one prisoner's escape. Explain how the various elements of the allegory of the cave work.

	How the Allegory of the Cave Works	
All human beings are trapped by their societies and their natures.	Beyond the cave, the Sun (which represents the Form of the Good) illuminates reality just as, within the cave, the fire illuminates the imitation of reality.	Human beings who escape the cave find the prospect of returning to it unattractive and the prisoners pitiable.
