The application of utilitarianism involves an identical process to the application of any normative ethical theory. This process begins with identifying an ethical issue in a branch of applied ethics (e.g. animal ethics or military ethics). Once an issue is identified, the normative ethical theory is applied by asking how an adherent of the theory would address the issue.
