What's Happening at CCA

It is hard to believe that we have been living with COVID-19 for two years. Every day I am hoping for an end but there appears to be no end in sight. We are doing our best to remain open, as we know most of our students do not do well with remote learning. Every day is challenging with the increase in staff and students testing positive. We will do our best to keep you informed and updated as we need to make calendar/schedule adjustments. Even as the pandemic lingers, I am confident that by working together we can continue to remain open and provide quality programming.

In the mist of the COVID turmoil, we have continued to provide awesome and creative programming. Some exciting things we have been able to participate in include re-opening the coffee cart, field trips, Agricultural Day, trunk-or-treat, student-sponsored holiday gift sale, and winter holiday celebrations. The PTO group sponsored a basket raffle, sold LaRosa's Buddy Cards, and provided a wonderful holiday luncheon for staff. Additionally, we were able to offer in-house booster shots for staff, as well as vaccines and booster shots for students.

Even though we have halted enrollment due to staffing and space, we have been able to maintain serving 56 students with 54 staff. We have also continued expanding our consultation services to school districts. It has been a goal to offer school districts behavior services so students can remain in their local school districts. We started offering families feeding therapy sessions in the summer through our speech therapy department, which have continued through the year. This service can be billed through insurance. Please contact me if you are interested in participating. We are continuing to partner with universities. We have an intern student this semester from Wright State University in the Rehabilitation Services program and we are working with University of Cincinnati students in providing hours for their service learning projects. We have started planning our summer services programming and will keep you updated when finalized. As always, please contact me with any questions or concerns.

CCA received a very generous donation of \$25,000 from Clarke Power Services.
