1. Who is Neil Messer and what are his key ideas on situation ethics?

Neil Messer (b. 1965) is a British philosopher and theologian. In the 1990s, he completed a diploma in theology and began an ordained ministry in the United Reformed Church. Thereafter, he received a MA in Christian ethics from King's College London, became a lecturer at the University of Wales, and, in 2005, published his popular textbook, Christian Ethics. Since his forties, he has worked at the University of Winchester, formerly as a head of department and reader and latterly as a professor. Make a note about who he was and what he does.
