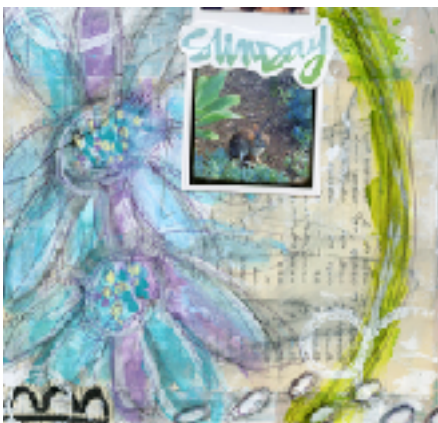

## Art-Full Attaché Art Journaling Workshop Description:

You asked for it, and I've delivered with my most ambitious, jam-packed workshop yet! In over 50 videos and 10 hours of instruction, you'll follow my progress through creating a 30+ page journal that's fit to burst at the seams.

Full of color and my unique collage work, you'll get key insights into my joyous signature style while learning how you can create your very own delicious journal in a step-by-step guide that lets you choose when you want to study. Our mission is to layer, paint, and stitch together an altered attaché ready for your personal narrative.



## SUPPLIES:

- Assortment of scrap papers such as old book papers, ledger papers, file folder, etc.
- Anthropologie catalog or other catalog.
- One gift bag with handles. Fabric handles are nice as they will become the handles of our attache. I use an Anthropologie bag.
- Piece of cardstock or paper cut to 2 x 11 – used for the sewing template in binding of the pages.
- Old key card
- Cracker or cereal bag (this is clear bag that crackers or cereal is package in).
- Three (3) pieces of 12 x 12 scrapbook paper.
- Envelopes – security, vellum, etc.
- Assorted letter/number stickers and/or rubons.

**If you want to make your own clear pocket you will need:**

- Double fold bias tape – .25 inches wide in black
- Clear vinyl

I use a [classification folder](#) (sometimes you can find these as singles in an office supply store) for the base of the journal.
