In October, the therapy department started "Breakfast Club", a school-wide food program focused on positive food exposure and exploration. Apples will be introduced in November!

Students' speech and occupational therapy sessions will also follow a new and exciting theme each month. In October, students engaged in a variety of 'Camping' activities during individual therapy sessions. They also participated in combined speech & OT group sessions with their classroom peers. Group activities included sensory bins and guessing games for students to test their senses of touch and sound. November's therapy theme is 'Transportation Station'!







The T.I.M.E program students have been busy so far this school year. We are volunteering at Meals on Wheels, putting together snack boxes every Monday. Tuesdays a group goes to The Laundry Spot to work on job skills. Wednesdays we go to Matthew 25 and help them sort or pack items to be donated around the world. We have been to Crayons to Computers doing various jobs in their facility. We help make dog treats at Brew Haus Bakery. Also, we have a group going to Pohlman Lanes to work and then enjoy a few frames of bowling.

The students have been able to work on their community skills at places such as Blue Ash Chili, Five Below, Dollar Tree, Loveland Castle, Winton Woods Park, Valley Thrift Store, Burwinkle Farm, and the Art Museum. While in the community we work on volume of our voice, giving people personal space, table manners, listening to staff, staying within a budget, dollar up math, advocating for themselves by making a choice as to what to buy, and communicating with members of the community.
